We take a short Scripture passage and simply let God speak to us through the words, guiding us to reflections that sometimes seem to come from nowhere. But they're not "from nowhere." They're from God. People are often surprised at how easy it is to pray this way, and how deep such prayer can be. Look for them at our entrances of church and also at SS.
