Life Teen (Mass and Life Nights) moves to St. Joseph next Sunday, January 21st.

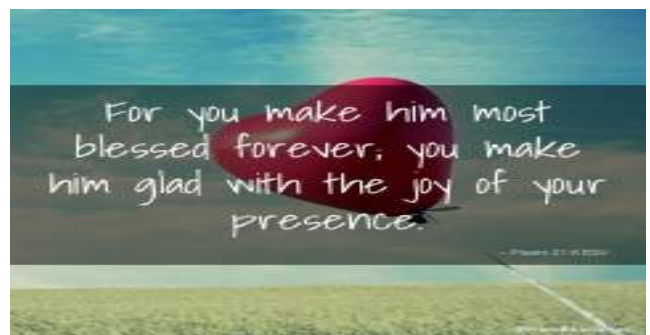

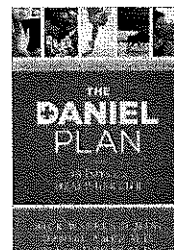
Wellness Groups

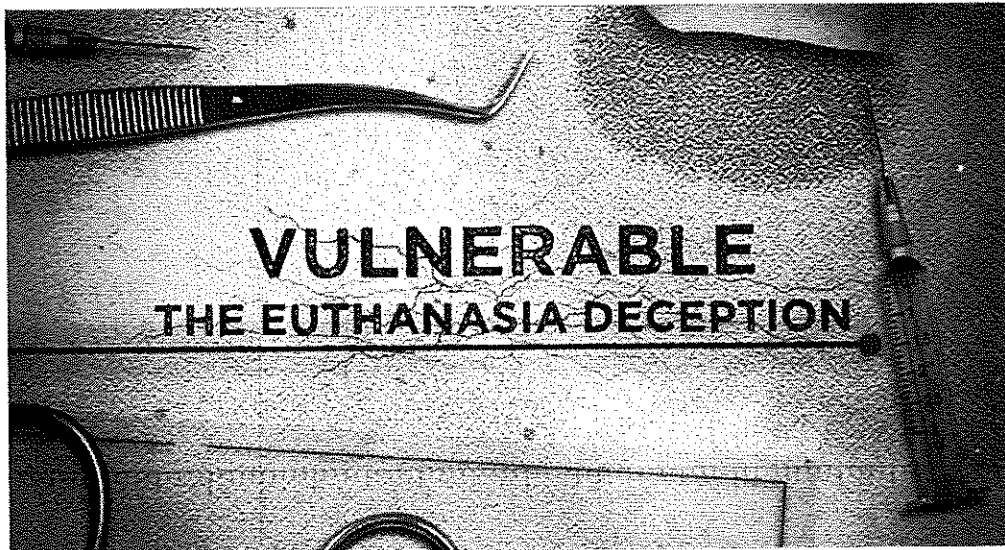

Join us for a showing of The Euthanasia Deception

The Euthanasia Deception is a one-hour documentary featuring powerful testimonies from Belgium and beyond - of those devastated by the false ideology of 'mercy killing'.

The film sets out to expose three main deceptions of doctor assisted dying:

- First, that euthanasia and assisted suicide are a form of compassion.
- The second is the myth of autonomy: that decisions made between doctor and patient operate in a vacuum.
- And finally, that government 'safeguards' can truly protect the vulnerable.

With expert analysis from both medical and legal professions, the film reveals the serious, long-term implications of assisted dying laws, and proves that all of us become vulnerable when end-of-life care is handed over to lawmakers.

The film is produced by the Euthanasia Prevention Coalition in association with [DunnMedia](#) and supported by thousands of like-minded organizations and individuals throughout the world.



LOCAL K OF C SPONSOR YOUTH FREE THROW CHAMPIONSHIP JANUARY 19TH

All boys and girls ages 9 to 14 are invited to participate in the local level of competition for the 2018 Knights of Columbus Free Throw Championship. The local competition will be held Friday, January 19th at 4:00 P.M. registration and practice, and start at 4:30 P.M. in the St John Bosco/Corpus Christi gym in Sturgeon Bay.

There is no entry fee. The Knights of Columbus Free Throw Championship is sponsored annually by Msgnr. Broens Council #2478 of Sturgeon Bay with winners progressing through local, district, and state competition. International champions are announced by the K of C international headquarters based on scores from the state-level competitions. All boys and girls 9 to 14 years old as of January 1st, 2018 are eligible to participate and compete in the respective age divisions. Last year more than 120,000 sharpshooters participated in over 3,600 local competitions.
