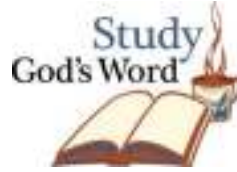

#### Lenten Fast and Abstinence

Those who have celebrated their 14<sup>th</sup> birthday are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and each Friday of Lent. Those who are age 18 until age 59, in addition to abstaining from meat, should fast, that is one full meal on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Two smaller meals are permitted on those two days. These practices are designed to spiritual growth. Ash Wednesday is March 6<sup>th</sup>, Good Friday is April 19<sup>th</sup> and Easter is April 21<sup>st</sup>.

## The Traditional Catholic Practice for Lent

**Prayer:** More intense personal and communal time with our God.

**Fasting:** In discovering our hunger, we find what we truly need.

1. Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are to abstain from meat on Ash Wed., all Fridays in Lent and Good Friday.
2. In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, until they celebrate their 59th birthday are to fast on Ash Wed. & Good Friday. Those who are bound to this regulation may only eat one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.
3. These minimal penitential practices should not be lightly excused.

**Almsgiving:** Giving of our goods and time in works of mercy and charity.


