This participation of the Eucharistic sacrifice signifying "intimacy, a becoming one with" an intimate union with Christ. Further, what do they become who receive Communion? The body of Christ.

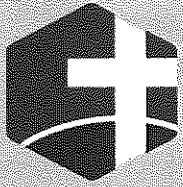
40 Days of Life

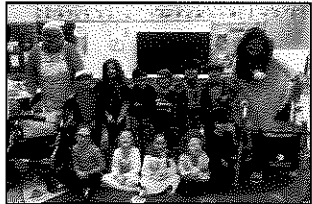


Volleyball Clinic

SJB celebrated its 100th Day of School on Friday, February 1st. 4K and 5K students dressed



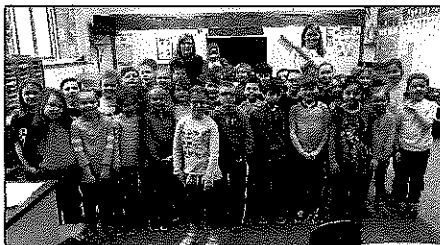
up like they were 100 years old. 4K made 100-day projects.
