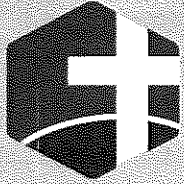

## From the Principal



A very busy summer came to an end when our school year began on August 28<sup>th</sup>. Father Ryan and Father Bob were here to meet the students and lead us in prayer for a faith filled prosperous year. I have been so blessed and thankful for our new teachers, new families and students, generous donors, and the strong work ethic that permeated throughout the school weeks before we opened. A busy August found teachers and my administrative assistants getting things prepared and organized for the start. The cleaning crew headed up by Clay Recuperio did a great job all summer and put on those final touches just days before we opened. Clay painted the first grade and second grade classrooms, giving them a facelift that was certainly needed. He also did work with the Gaga Pit so students could play in it all year long, no more mud. Other assorted jobs filled his 3 months with us. The gym/social hall got painted with 39 gallons of paint, at the end of July/beginning of August with help from a couple of current families and alumni: Morgan Reinhardt, Emma Reinhardt, Andrew Konop, Greta Fogarty, and Jackson Fogarty. It was great to see them come back and help. Dr. Dennis and Bonnie Connolly donated \$6,000 for books for our high-level readers and gift cards for all teachers for their classrooms. Dr. Plachetka donated \$15,000 for a new scoreboard for our gym coming at a perfect time since our old one (40 years old) had finally given up at the

end of last season. Numerous individuals have made donations to our Tuition Assistance program, thanks to each of them we are a bit ahead of where we were last year at this time. Three grants were received in August helping with the cost of the Gaga Pit top surfacing, more leveled books and more archery equipment. Rounding out my thank you's go to a team that worked to put on the most successful golf outing ever. Dave Weber headed up this group that included: Jim Stawicki, Joe Spude, Laura Peterson, Ellen Binard, and Paul Stoneman. Thank you, thank you, thank you. I have been blessed with so much and am happy the students and the staff are the beneficiaries of the many gifts. It truly takes a community.

The first day of school for St. John Bosco was Wednesday, August 28. The



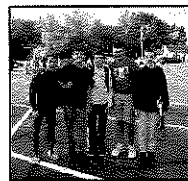

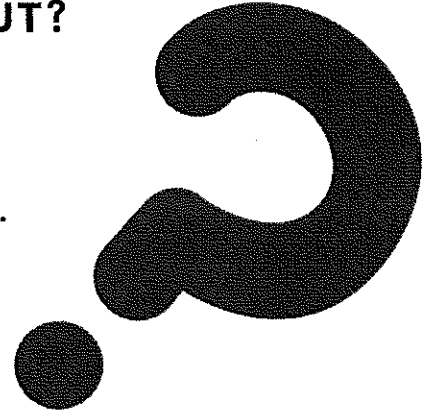
