

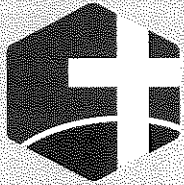

From the Principal



A colleague gave me a book, *A Minute of Margin*, a book of short, thoughtful, insight, some years ago. I still pick it up occasionally and read for the wisdom and reflection I wish to have in my life. The below article is one that I have read many times, written by Norman Cousins, and would like to share with you. **Breaking the Speed Limit of Life.** We are a nation on the move and in a hurry, the people of the forward stampede. We eat fast food during rush hour. We ship by FedEx, place calls through Sprint, balance books on Quicken, and diet with SlimFast. We're hyper living, like field mice on amphetamines at harvest time, moving so fast we're passing up photons. Our global treadmill is equipped with an automatically advancing speed rheostat, and every year the world spins faster. Gone are the 1930's of *To Kill a Mockingbird*: "People moved slowly then. They ambled across the square, shuffled in and out of the stores around it, took their time about everything. A day was twenty-four hours long but seemed longer. There was no hurry, for there was nowhere to go, nothing to buy and no money to buy it with, nothing to see outside the boundaries of Maycomb County." If people were bored in 1930, we are breathless and exhausted now. The speed phenomenon is not only subjectively true but objectively measurable. Because progress gives us more and more, faster and faster, the escalating pace of daily life is both

scientifically verifiable and a permanent feature of the modern age. Personally, I don't mind going *fast*. I don't even mind going *faster*. But going *too fast* is another issue altogether. It is not wrong to enjoy the pleasure of being efficient and productive. But the anguish of being gasping, resentful, and consumed is real, compliments excessive speed. Is there a speed limit to life . . . a pace beyond which the brain, body, and spirit begin to suffer? What happens when we exceed this limit? Clearly there is such a limit, and clearly many of us exceed it routinely. The increase in ambient speed is one of the most pressing problems of our time. Our lives are nonstop. We walk fast, talk fast, eat fast, and then excuse ourselves by saying, "I must run." This frenzy is responsible for much personal and family dysfunction. Very little of lasting spiritual value happens in the presence of speed. Speed. Hurry. We pay a price for the pace at which we live.

Rx Consciously slow the pace of life. Take your foot off the accelerator pedal.
Throttle back.

Put on the brakes and obey the speed limit of the soul. The green pastures and still waters yet await us – but not in the direction the treadmill is spinning.

The 8th graders learned about scale and model representations along with earth/moon statistics. They also created a model moon

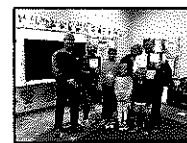


proportionate to an Earth model given to them. They determined the distance the moon needed to be from the Earth using a scale factor calculation in class. Next up, students will learn about moon phases.
