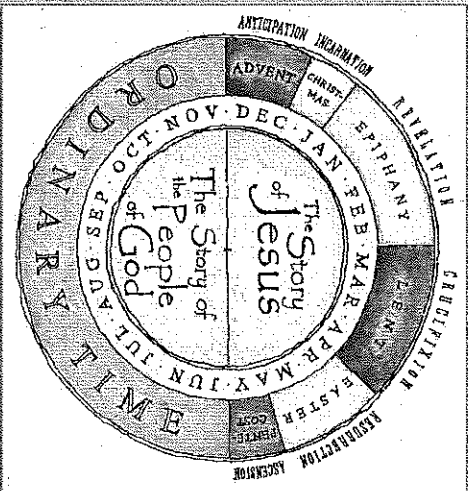
The Wreaths Have Arrived!!

By developing a special calendar, the Church gives us periodic reminders to keep our faith alive and inspire us to grow deeper in our love for Christ with the passing years. In the celebration of special days, the Church helps us to redeem the gift of time.

Like the four seasons, the Church year follows a cycle. There is a natural ebb and flow to the spiritual life of the Church. In union with the motions of human nature, the Church year gradually unfolds the mysteries of Christ's life, repeating the cycle each year.

Liturgical Color: white

Ordinary Time: *The Experience of Journey*

Themes: growth, journeying in and with Christ, growing in our understanding of what it means to live the Gospel

Liturgical Color: green

Lent: *The Experience of Healing*

Themes: prayer, penance, acts of kindness, fasting, solitude

Liturgical Color: purple with a reddish hue

Paschal Triduum:

Easter: *The Experience of Transformation*

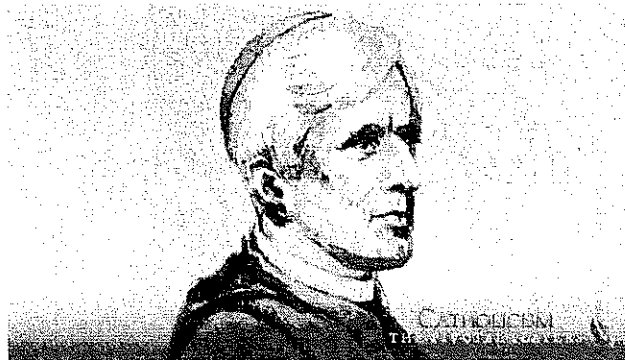
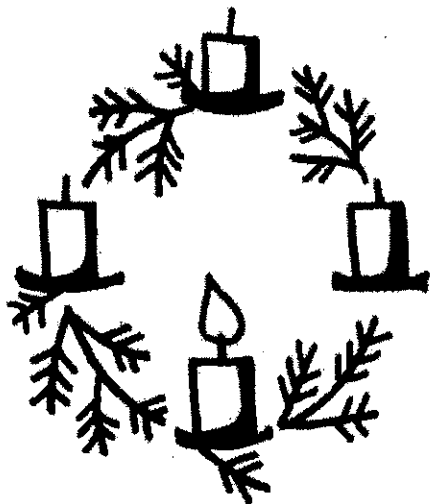
Themes: new life in Christ, light, Christian victory

Liturgical Color: white (red for Pentecost)

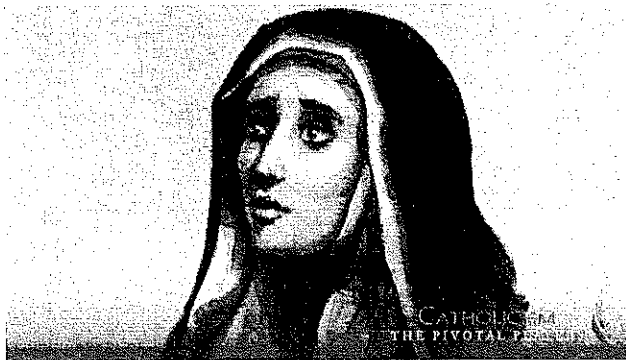

With songs, prayers, rituals, mysteries, stories and devotions, the Church marks time with beauty and seeks to transform the believers. It celebrates the good news of life to be lived in abundance. The Liturgical Year appeals to the hearts and minds of believers and as it turns and invites us to accept a conversion of life, a metanoia – of leaving behind the old and putting on the mind of Christ. Like a school of transformation, the Liturgical Year teaches us lessons, old and new – the same tradition of meaning turned around again and again giving insight into how the Church sanctifies our days that are turned into season of distinct celebrations and cast the light of eternity on the inner meaning of our human existence in time. John Henry Newman, the Convert, was called a traitor in every part of England due to his conversion from Anglicanism to Catholicism. Always searching for the truth, Newman had poured over the writings of the Church Fathers and came to believe the Catholic religion embodied the fullest measure of God's revealed truth.



St. Catherine of Siena, the Mystic, witnessed to the existence of a dimension beyond the physical world in a particularly vivid way. At age six, she experienced the first of many visions that formed a lifelong dialogue with Christ, just as if he were on earth with her. Steeped in contemplative prayer, Catherine was fueled and directed by Christ on many missions, both to serve the poor and sick, and also to serve the Church at the highest level by advising two popes.


