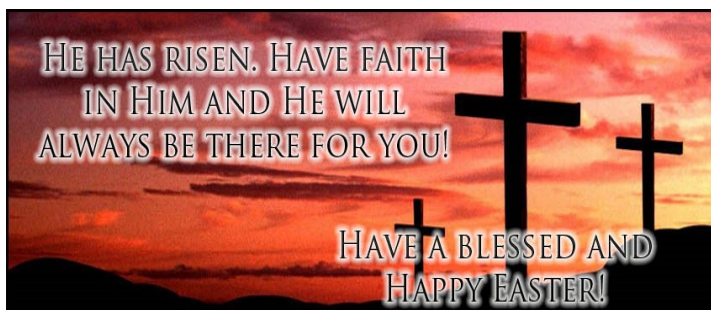

Divine Mercy Sunday April 19

In celebration of Divine Mercy Sunday, and in solidarity of stay home, stay safe, we invite you to join the Church in praying the Chaplet of Divine Mercy at **3:00 pm**.

The Chaplet of Divine Mercy was dictated to Sister Faustina by the Lord Jesus Himself in Vilnius on September 13-14, 1935, as a prayer of atonement for the appeasement of God's wrath (see Dairy 474-476).

Those who recite this Chaplet offer to God the Father "the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity," of Jesus Christ in atonement for their sins, the sins of their loved ones and those of the whole world.

How to pray the Chaplet:

- Using the rosary: **On the crucifix**, say the Sign of the Cross.

- **First bead:** Opening Prayer: You expired Jesus, but the source of life gushed forth for souls, and the ocean of mercy opened for the whole world. O Fount of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, envelope the whole world and empty Yourself out upon us. (Diary, 1319).

(Say three times): O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fount of mercy for us, I trust in You.

- **On the next three beads**, say one Our Father, one Hail Mary, and the Apostles Creed.

- **Fifth bead:** Eternal Father, I offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your dearly beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

- **On the Hail Mary beads** of each decade say: For the sake of His sorrowful Passion have mercy on us and on the whole world.

- **On each Our Father bead**, repeat fifth bead prayer.

- **After the five decades say the concluding doxology (three times):** Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

- **Closing Prayer:** Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless, and the treasury of compassion inexhaustible, look kindly upon us, and increase Your mercy in us, that in difficult moments, we might not despair, not become despondent, but with great confidence, submit ourselves to Your holy will, which is Love and Mercy Itself. Amen.
