Solemnity of the Holy Body and Blood of Christ – celebrating the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.

This is an amazing feast that celebrates the reality that it truly is Christ in the Eucharist. What could be more important than this? The solemnity of the Eucharist is when we partake of the Eucharist and know that it is the most solemn event in our lives.

Do we pay attention to our posture when we are going up to receive the Eucharist? Do we hold our hands in humbleness? What do our hearts feel like? This is our time to express our love for Jesus. How do we show that as we walk up the aisle for Communion? Our actions should be deliberate, humble as we approach our Lord in the anticipation and joy of receiving Him. It is a solemn time to reflect on what Jesus means to me. Direct your thoughts to Him. As you walk up for Communion, step into Christ. Step forward to meet God. When we receive the Body of Christ it should be a solemn reminder that God dwells in us.

The importance of this ritual is so monumental in our lives. Each of us should know that this is our last supper, our moment with Christ, just like the disciples. It is so monumental that we are given this personal moment with Christ. The physical digestion of the host is another opportunity for us to feel that Christ is within us. It should awaken the memory of our Divine Self – that Christ is in us.

We should also feel the spirituality of it – we are infused with Jesus. This is our chance to feel the veil lifted or parted. It is a reminder that, Oh yah! I am a spiritual being too. Oh yah! I am a part of this. The veil is parted to see the true you. It is a wake-up call every time for us to come to realization that I am a Diving Being.

If you are unable to partake in the Eucharist, there should be no guilt, shame or anything about not being in Church right now. It is what it is right now. You don't need a wooden pew or a church building to realize that you are a part of something bigger – that you are a Divine Being. We will have our fellowship again. But for now, you can have communion with Jesus and God in your own personal way.

Perhaps it is walking in the woods, reading scripture or a spiritual book. Perhaps it is sitting quietly in your chair with your mind on Jesus. You can communion with God in your own way and know that God is with you. Make a little ritual of praise, and remember, Oh yah! I am part of something bigger. God is with and in each of us. Just remember to say, I am a part of this. God is in me. Find comfort in knowing that God is with you wherever you are. You just have to open your heart to it. You hold Church in your heart.
