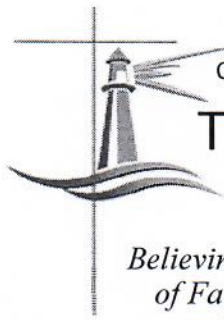

Ordinary Time I – A Time of Transformation

The spiraling adventure of the Liturgical Year continues to move us along from its beginning in Advent to Christmas and now to the entrance into Ordinary Time. This short period between the two poles of the life of Jesus – His Incarnation and Resurrection gives us a time to contemplate the intersection between the life of Jesus and our own. It is a time of deep spiritual and Divine contemplation. But how do we enter this contemplative time when our present lives are anything but ordinary?

By focusing on another dimension of the spiritual life, we may find the means to journey through Ordinary Time with joy and spiritual maturity. This is a time of transformation when we can all be transformed from humble beginnings to prophets of today. It all has to do with how we carry ourselves in love – rising above our fear, frustration, anger, and finding love. This is what Ordinary Time is all about. Yet it seems impossible to find the peace and love of Ordinary Time when we are so surrounded by such extraordinary events. We need now, more than ever, to be vigilant to find peace.

As we move forward into “all time” – Ordinary Time we need to allow ourselves to be transformed into beings of Light and Love. Let us remain hopeful, for we are truly capable of transformation by turning toward the Light. Turn to Light, Love and Jesus and find the peace in faith, the sacraments and the life of Jesus. Hold on. Reach out to the assurance that Jesus, that God, is taking care of the World.
