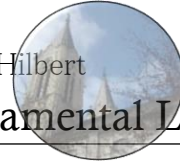

Living A Sacramental Life



Today I would like to tell you a true story about a close friend of mine. About two years ago she rode with me to Cathedral Book and Gift in Green Bay. She had never been in the bookstore before but was eager to see what it was like as she is an avid reader. However, upon entering the store her life was changed forever. Within moments of stepping across the threshold she was overcome with intense emotion. So intense, in fact, that she had to step into one of the side rooms to compose herself. I was worried when I discovered her crouched over in a chair sobbing and almost shaking. I asked her what was wrong, but she couldn't speak. She continued to sob and sob, completely overcome with this raw emotion. Finally, when she was able to speak, she cried out, "I am home!" As it turns out, my dear friend had been baptized in the Catholic Church when she was three months old. Her upbringing though, did not include any further education in the Catholic Church and her spirituality took many twists and turns, until that beautiful morning in the bookstore when God let her know she was HOME! My friend is now going through the RCIA program and will soon come into full communion in the Church and member of our parish. She has truly come home!

This is the grace of Baptism – the inner workings of God in our lives. And, like the experience of my friend, His coming is often quite a surprise. The spirit of Ordinary Time calls us to reflect on the life of Jesus and the intersecting of our lives and His. As we continue growing in the movement of the Liturgical Year, it is the perfect time for renewal, a time to think about those pivotal moments when God reminded us that we are His children. We need to be reminded of our deep connection to Jesus, and the Sacraments are ways of doing this. We walk together with Jesus in this life. We learn together. We grow together. It is through the Sacraments that we become one with God. They are pivotal moments when we make an official commitment to align ourselves to Jesus – forever. The Sacraments anchor us in our faith. Secure them and make sure they are hooked solidly. Once we are a recipient of the Sacraments we are permanently bound, never to be broken to the rituals of God at work in us.

Sacramental living is about putting Jesus front and center so we can always look through Him as we navigate through life. He says to us: *"I am on your side. Just remember, I am here. We are connected. That partnership will carry you through anything."* Several years ago, a relative asked me, "How do you know the host is really Jesus and not just a wafer?" I never doubted before but began to question what I had believed to be the truth for almost my entire life. Each time I would go to Communion I questioned. I had recently purchased a new camera and was taking pictures inside church. Walking up the two steps to take a picture of the tabernacle candle, I heard this voice call me. *"Monica."* I turned to the tabernacle which had transformed to this brilliant, radiant gold and heard a voice say, *"Monica, it is Me."* I sat on the step and cried, never, ever to doubt again. It was truly a sacramental moment when Jesus made sure I would never wander too far away.

Stop and reflect on those triggers that have given you the same profound feeling as my friend and I – those moments that triggered awareness of Jesus' presence. Often these trigger moments sneak up on us. Be vigilant. Stay awake! Pay attention to the moments that pulled you back to a peak awareness of a sacramental moment. Let it rekindle your heart. Pull back to your own Baptism during these turbulent times and let the Sacraments rest most beautifully in your heart. They are real. They are holy. They are part of your soul. Become sacramentally aware of the surprises and graces of the Sacraments - the workings of God in your life and the glimpses of Him you have been allowed to catch. Remember, always be grateful.
