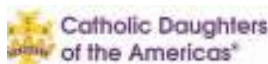

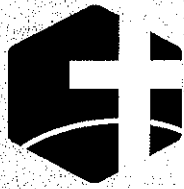
**Collection to Support USCCB Bishop's

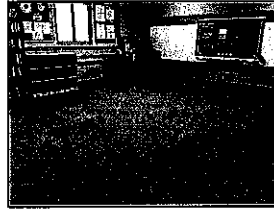
### Floor Cleaning at SJB

*Movement of the People of God*

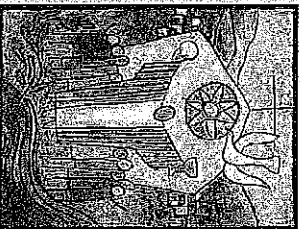
Movement of Who? Of What?

In the Rule of Saint Benedict, liturgy is described as "Opus Dei" - The Work of God.



- **Liturgy**

*Public Work*

In our Catholic Catechism, Liturgy as public work means - service in the name of, or on behalf of the people.



In the Christian tradition work means, "the participation of the People of God in the "work of God." It is through the Liturgy, that Jesus continues the work of our redemption - in, with, and through the Church.



**Liturgy as a whole,**  
has transformed in many ways and to mean different things.

- **The Sacraments** - including Eucharist
- **Liturgy of the Hours** - Liturgy of the Hours, also known as the Divine Office or the Work of God (Opus Dei), is the daily prayer of the Church, marking the hours of each day ...
- **Liturgical Year** - Order of the Liturgical Year - seasons solemnities, feasts, memorials
- **Liturgy of the Word** - 1<sup>st</sup> part of the Mass and ends with the Prayers of the Faithful
- **Liturgy of the Eucharist** - 2<sup>nd</sup> part of the Mass beginning with the Presentation of the Gifts and concludes with the Prayer after Communion
