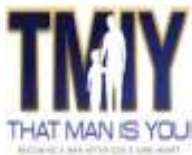

World Mission Sunday - October 23rd & 24th




Spirituality of the Liturgy

Spirituality of Liturgy – A Reflection of the Long Haul

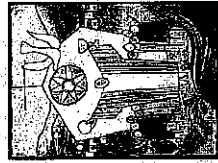

We defined Liturgy partly as: The movement of the people of God. However, this suggests that Liturgy is a verb. But it can also be a noun when we apply it to our understanding of the Mass.

We can consider liturgical spirituality in two ways:

- one, what happens when we participate in the Mass – how our presence makes a difference to those around us
- two, how we allow what we do at the Liturgy to permeate the rest of our lives.

Our participation in the Liturgy is a vital part of our lives as Christians. Through this participation we are gradually transformed into the people God intends us to be.



Mass is to celebrate the Eucharist.

To help in our understanding of what the spirituality of Liturgy is, consider the automobile, something we use in our everyday lives.

An automobile is a thing that is capable of movement – if it has fuel. Without fuel it is stagnant and can not fulfill its complete purpose in our lives. With fuel that automobile becomes an amazing machine that can take us places – shopping, to visit friends, travel, and church. It becomes so much more because someone has infused it with fuel. It becomes all it's supposed to be and has fulfilled its designed purpose.

There are many components of Liturgy, but for the Liturgy to be transformative, it must be fueled by something, just as an automobile needs fuel to fulfill its purpose. What is that fuel? All we have to do is let the Holy Spirit, God and Jesus into our hearts. If we try to open our minds and hearts – that is the fuel that will cause the transformation in us.

As we come to Mass we should come with the openness to be moved by Jesus, touched by the Holy Spirit and propelled by God. Coming with that intention is huge. By partaking of the Eucharist we take in Jesus. We take Him into our hearts. When these Holy Spirit moments happen to us, it turns the Liturgy into an action word because then the people that partake of that Liturgy are transformed. Thus, we carry the Liturgy out the door and into our lives. We have been moved – that is the spirituality of Liturgy. Its purpose is to transform us to go out into the world; and we do this over and over.

We are a piece of the Liturgy, much like the car. We transform. We travel. We journey. The Holy Spirit is our fuel – what are we without the Holy Spirit? She is the one who ignites our soul. We are an integral part of Liturgy. We move Liturgy from a noun to a powerful action verb. We ignite God's flame in each other on the road to do God's work – the work God intended us to do.
