

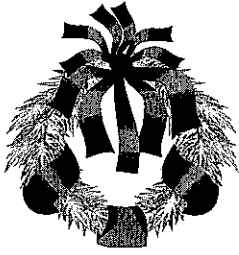

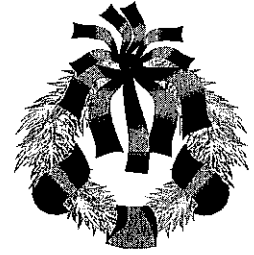

I share with you a story that I cut out of the newspaper 22 years ago and read each year as I begin the month of November and reflect on the blessings that have been shared with me. It is a good perspective on a lesson learned thru the eyes of a young boy.

What It Means To Be Poor . . .

One day a father of a very wealthy family took his son on a trip to the country with the firm purpose of showing his son how poor people can be. They spent a couple of days and nights on the farm of what would be considered a very poor family. On their return from their trip, the father asked his son "How was the trip?" "It was great, Dad." "Did you see how poor people can be?" the father asked. "Oh Yeah" said the son. "So what did you learn from the trip?" asked the father. The son answered, "I saw that we have one dog and they had four. We have a pool that reaches to the middle of our garden and they have a creek that has no end. We have imported lanterns in our garden and they have the stars at night. Our patio reaches to the front yard and they have the whole horizon. We have a small piece of land to live on and they have fields that go beyond our sight. We have servants who serve us, but they serve others. We buy our food, but they grow theirs. We have walls around our property to protect us, they have friends to protect them." With this the boy's father was speechless. Then his son added, "Thanks dad for

showing me how poor we are." Too many times we forget what we have and concentrate on what we don't have. What is one person's worthless object is another's prize possession. It is all based on one's thanks for all the bounty we have, instead of worrying about wanting more. 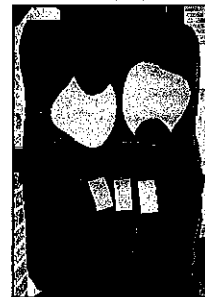

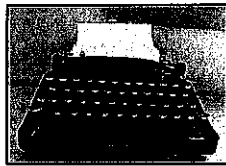

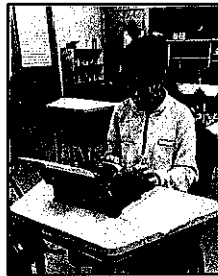
7th Grade Poems

The 6th graders used new microscopes to study plant, protist and



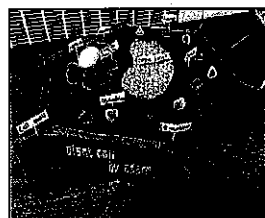
animal cells. They then used what they learned to build their own cell structures. They had to make a cell, label each structure and

7th Grade PLTW

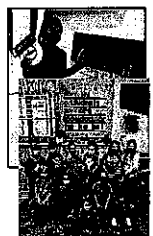
